# PVPLC presents Art Inspired by Nature film series July 19

The Palos Verdes Peninsula Land Conservancy's film series continues July 19 with "Chasing Ice" and the "Lost Bird Project" on September 20. Both are part of the second year of the film series that brings outdoor enthusiasts together to celebrate the importance of open space, with the films this year highlighting the inspiration that nature provides to artists.

"Chasing Ice" is the story of environmental photographer James Balof deploying time-lapse cameras to capture a multi-year record of the world's changing glaciers. The film will be screened at 4 p.m. in the John Olguin Auditorium, Cabrillo Marine Aquarium at 3720 Stephen M White Drive in San Pe-
