january 14, 9 am agua amarga reserve

Walk the trail, enjoy the view and appreciate the results of many volunteers' trail and habitat restoration efforts in this quiet neighborhood canyon. Moderate. RPV

february 11, 9 am mcbride trail

Walk a rimmed canyon trail with stunning panoramic views and an overlook of a 96-acre addition to the nature preserve. Easy. RPV

march 11, 9 am alta vicente reserve

Explore rare cactus wren and California gnatcatcher restored habitat. Enjoy beautiful views of Catalina Island and flowers in bloom. Moderate to strenuous. RPV

april 8, 9 am ocean trails reserve

Walk through an impressively-restored habitat on top of an ancient slide area with spectacular bluff-top ocean views that are well worth the visit. Easy to moderate. **RPV**

may 13, 9 am linden h. chandler preserve

Experience this 28-acre nature preserve with blooming native plants. This restored habitat is home to the endangered Palos Verdes blue butterfly. Moderate. **RHE**

june 10, 9 am sacred coveabalone cove reserve

Situated in the Abalone Cove Reserve and located between Portuguese Point and Inspiration Point, this secluded cove features wonderful rock formations edged with tide pools and a channel into a sea cave. Moderate to strenuous. **RPV**

july 8, 9 am vicente bluffs reserve

Follow the bluff top from Point Vicente to Oceanfront Estates during the El Segundo blue butterfly flight season in an area containing restored coastal sage scrub habitat. Easy. RPV

august 12, 9 am george f canyon preserve

Wander along a willowfilled canyon stream with restored coastal sage scrub habitat. Look down on the Peninsula's rare Catalina Schist from one of the few places you can see the exposed rock. Easy to moderate. **RHE**

september 9, 9 am forrestal reserve

Appreciate some of the best wildflower viewing and dramatic geological formations on the cliffs of this former basalt quarry. See the faults, folds and igneous intrusions visible in the sedimentary bedding. Moderate to strenuous. RPV

october 14, 9 am malaga dunes

Explore this unique area on the Peninsula with creekside habitat, diminutive tree frogs, and land formed on windblown sand dunes. Easy to Moderate. **PVE**

november 11, 9 am white point nature preserve

Celebrate Veterans Day walking through restored coastal sage scrub habitat and stop at a former gun emplacement to learn about the military history of the area. Don't miss the Nature Education Center with activities for the whole family. Easy to moderate. San Pedro (LA)

december 9, 9 am portuguese bend reserve

Enjoy one of the best overlooks of the 1,500acre PV Nature Preserve. Take in magnificent ocean views and walk through habitat restored after a 2009 wildfire. Moderate to strenuous. **RPV**

january 13, 2024 9 am three sisters reserve

Hike through a scenic 21acre restored coastal sage scrub habitat which is home to the threatened California gnatcatcher. Moderate. RPV



Directions & Parking

January 14, 9 am Agua Amarga Reserve – From Hawthorne Blvd., turn west onto Verde Ridge Rd., right on El Rodeo, left on Kings Harbor Dr. Park on street and meet at Rock Park Dr. cul-de-sac. RPV

February 11, 9 am McBride Trail – From Crest Rd., turn south on Highridge Rd. then turn right on Ocean Terrace Dr. Park at end of Ocean Terrace Dr. RPV

March 11, 9 am Alta Vicente Reserve – Parking on Hawthorne Blvd. side of Rancho Palos Verdes City Hall, 30940 Hawthorne Blvd. RPV

April 8, 9 am Ocean Trails Reserve – Street parking where Palos Verdes Dr. South becomes 25th St., west of Mermaid Dr. Meet at the East Boundary Trail trailhead. RPV

May 13, 9 am Linden H. Chandler Preserve – Park at Rolling Hills Little League baseball field parking lot. From Palos Verdes Dr. North, turn north toward Dapplegray Elementary and make an immediate left before the school and follow the road around the school down to the ball field. RHE

June 10, 9 am Abalone Cove Reserve – Park in lot at Abalone Cove Shoreline Park. 5970 Palos Verdes Drive South. Parking cost: \$6 first 2 hours. Free 62 years+. RPV

July 8, 9 am Vicente Bluffs Reserve – Park in the dirt lot in front of the Point Vicente Lighthouse. RPV

August 12, 9 am George F Canyon Nature Preserve Meet on rear deck of the nature center. 27305 Palos Verdes Dr. East. Additional parking in dirt lot 100 yards to the south on Palos Verdes Dr. East. RHE

September 9, 9 am Forrestal Reserve – Park on Forrestal Dr. inside the gated area close to Pirate Trail Trailhead/ Ladera Linda Community Center. Meet at Reserve gate entrance on Forrestal Dr. RPV

October 14, 9 am Malaga Dunes – Park at the east end of the Via Tejon cul-de-sac. PVE

November 11, 9 am White Point Nature Preserve – Park in lot at 1600 West Paseo del Mar. Must enter Paseo del Mar via Western Avenue. Entrance is at the street deadend. San Pedro (LA)

December 9, 9 am Portuguese Bend Reserve – Park on Crenshaw Blvd. south of Crest Rd. near Del Cerro Park. RPV

January 13, 2024, 9 am Three Sisters Reserve – Park at St. Peter's By the Sea Church, 6410 Palos Verdes Dr. South. RPV
